



### **Project Newsletter: July 2014**









The EPIC Project has had a very busy six months with nominating our Second Cohort and a Call for Extensions!

#### **EPIC's Second Call**

The second Call for Applications was open from 30<sup>th</sup> September to 15<sup>th</sup> November 2013. This was extended to 1<sup>st</sup> December 2013 for post-doctorate candidates. As EPIC's first round of applications had been very successful, the second Call was restricted to EU at undergraduate, post-doctorate and staff level, and Lot countries at staff level only, with the exception of Lebanese applicants who could also apply at undergraduate level.

The Selection Committee was held via video conference on 7<sup>th</sup> of January 2014 with representatives from all Lot countries and the EU. The Committee nominated **34 scholars**: 15 Undergraduates, 10 Post-doctorates and 9 Staff.

Some of these Cohort 2 scholars have already mobilised! The post-doctorates and undergraduates will start their mobility by 31<sup>st</sup> December 2014.

The aim of the EPIC project was to achieve 175 mobility flows which we have now exceeded. The total number currently stands at 214 scholars.





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### Call for extensions

As the project had exceeded its target for nominated scholars, it was decided at the Selection Committee to use the small surplus of budget to launch a Call for Extensions.

The Call for Extensions was open for one week from the 13<sup>th</sup> of February 2014. We received 54 requests for extension and the quality of the applications was very high. We are able to grant 36 extensions from our remaining budget, across all types of mobilities and to scholars of various nationalities.

#### International cooperation

In February of this year we successfully submitted our Second Progress Report to the European Commission. As part of this Report, we gathered more examples of institutional cooperation that have developed from being part of the EPIC project. Here are just a few:

- University of Saint Joseph reinforced their cooperation with Sciences Po in Paris
- A staff exchange from German-Jordanian University to La Sapienza University of Rome resulted in a publication of their research work and a Horizon 2020 proposal for further collaboration
- The Faculty of Natural Sciences at Vilnius University is investigating a joint Master programme in the field of cartography with Princess Sumaya University of Technology.
